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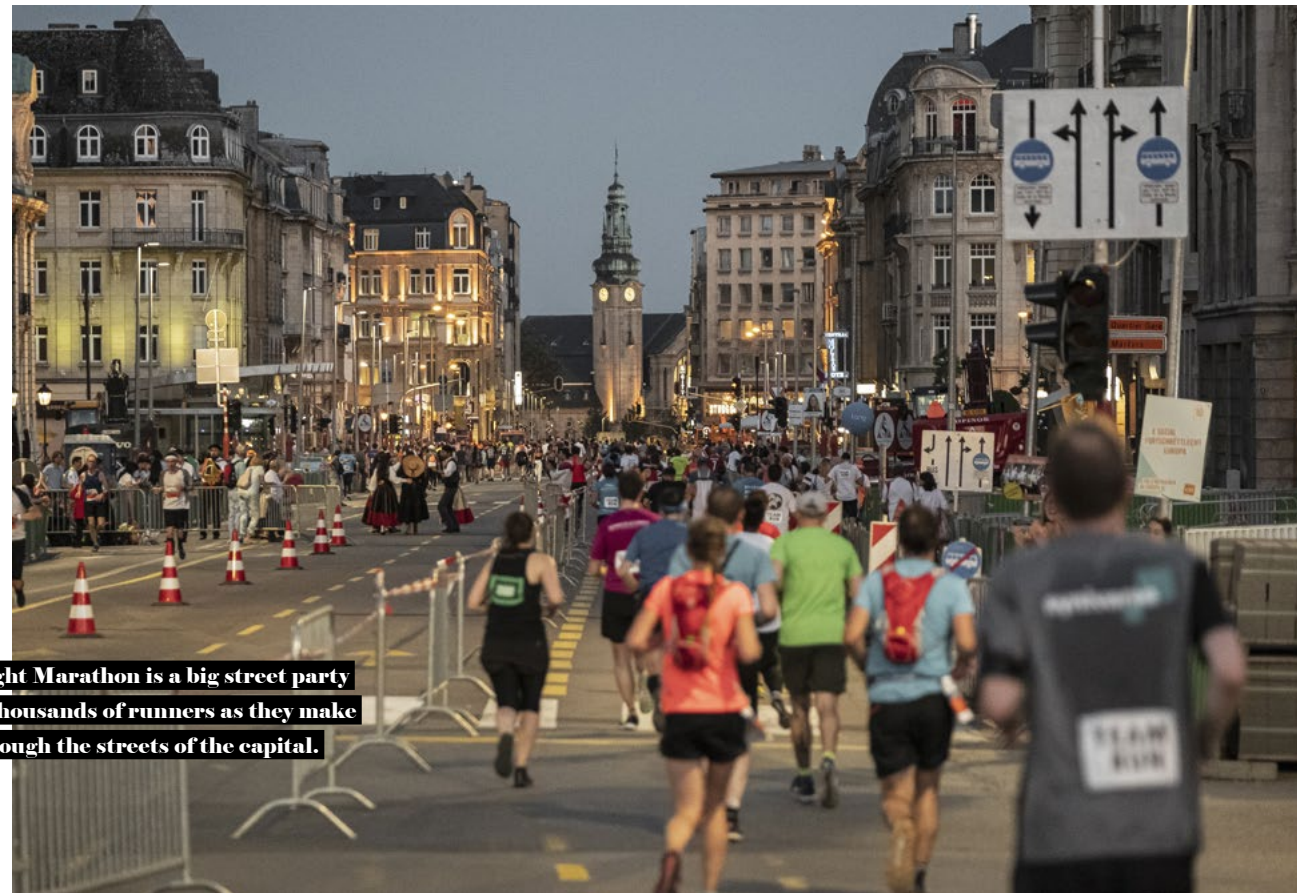
- Strategically located in the heart of Western Europe.

# Location

- Luxembourg borders Germany, Belgium, France and offers easy access to every big and small city around.
- Luxembourg city is part of the QuattroPole city network. Four cities in three countries: Luxembourg, Metz, Saarbrücken and Trier. All just an hour's drive from each other.
- The central train station is situated 10 minutes walking distance from the city centre or 5 minutes by tram. Luxembourg is connected to the far corners of Europe by a multitude of international rail links. The capital city is linked to TGV (Paris – Luxembourg 2h05) and ICE network.
- Luxair, the national airline, has flights to most European hubs. Luxembourg Airport is only ten minutes by car from the city center. Connection to the tram is foreseen until 2024.
- Public transport in Luxembourg has been free since 2020.

# Recommendations

- Manageable to visit: stays of a few days offer the possibility to visit the main attractions of the country due to short distances within the country.
- Luxembourg is a top choice destination for business events, if it is for your next corporate, teambuilding or incentive event.
- Languages: Luxembourgish, German and French are the official languages of the country. Many residents also speak English.
- Best travel time: there is no shortage of things to see and do year-round. The best months to come are November – January, April – August (peak tourist season July – August), October.
- Events: Winterlights Festival (November – January), ING Night Marathon (May), Fête de la Musique (June), National Day on 23.06 with a big open-air party and fireworks the day before, Festival Blues Express (July), Schueberfouer (funfair, August – September) and even more.





From the dense and hilly forests of the Ardennes in the Éislek in the North of the country to the Mullerthal region of “Luxembourg’s Little Switzerland”, from the vineyards along the Moselle to the wild forests and meadows in the Gutland and the famous Minett Trail in the “Land of the Red Rocks”, Luxembourg’s landscapes will inspire you.



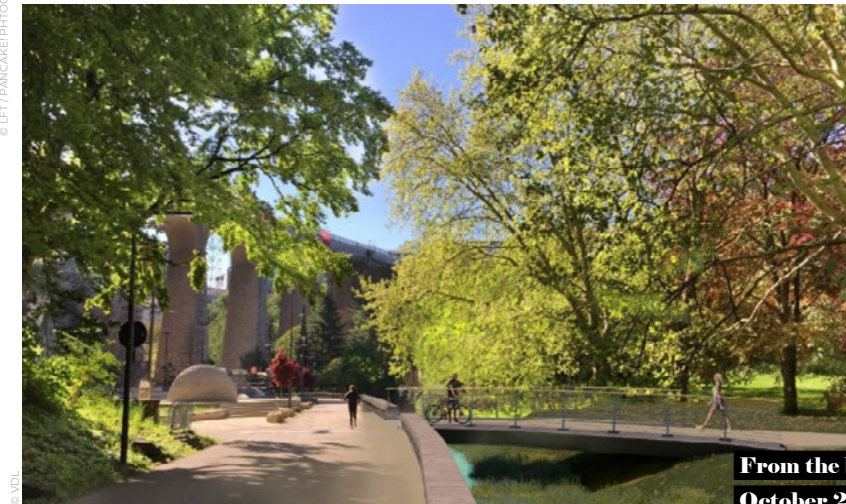
## Unique Event Spaces

## Where to stay

- Luxembourg has a wide variety of accommodation options: 1 - 5 star hotels, youth hostels, campsites...
- The enormous diversity of Luxembourg's hotels is down to the country's promotion of everything from the family hotel to the fantastic boutique hotel set in a historic chateau.
- 9 fully furnished youth hostels are located either in new or in thoroughly renovated buildings, in Luxembourg City and throughout the country.

**The youth hostel in Remerschen at the Moselle is housed in a former nunnery. Opposite is the Valentiny Foundation, which exhibits more than 3,000 objects from over 40 years of work by the internationally renowned architect François Valentiny.**



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## Upcoming Events

- Project GRIDX with Motorworld Luxembourg: In Wickrange, right next to the A4, a new place to work and meet is being built: the GRIDX. The centrepiece of the building will be Motorworld Luxembourg. Construction has already begun, and the project is scheduled for completion by the end of 2024.
- LUGA - Luxembourg Urban Garden: (May to October 2025): First major national horticultural exhibition in Luxembourg.



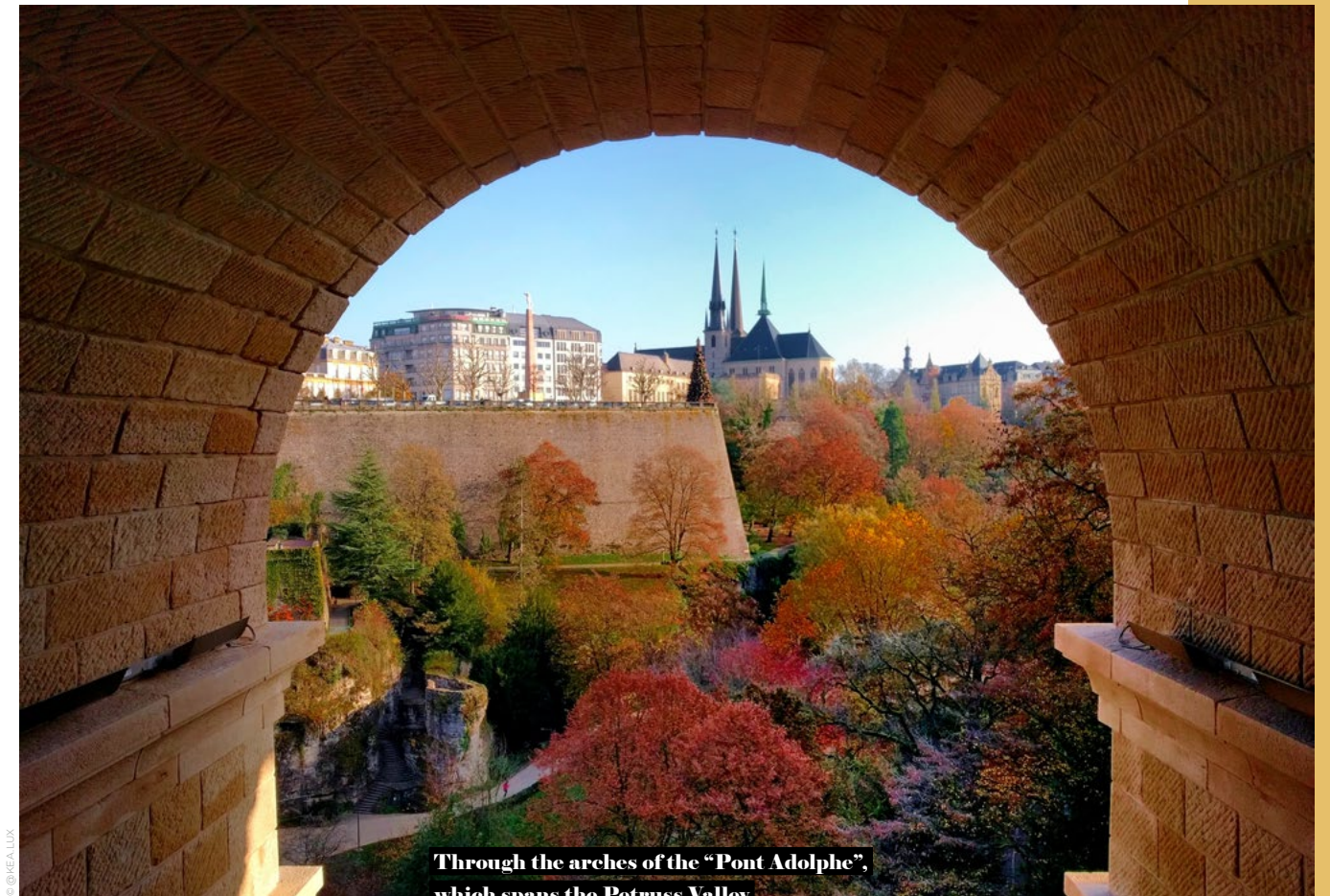
# Activities & Experiences

- Because despite being so small (2,586 km<sup>2</sup> and just under 626,000 inhabitants), the Grand Duchy has a particularly rich past.
- Built in the Middle Ages, the city centre is full of small, old buildings and remnants of its medieval past. The valley in the middle of the city boasts a river surrounded by greenery.
- Throughout the country, vestiges of the country's medieval history are also displayed in different museums, in the numerous castles and in the architecture of many towns throughout the Grand Duchy.
- The beautiful landscapes of the Luxembourgish countryside will appeal to your inner hiker. From the dense and hilly Ardennes forests in the north of the country to the Mullerthal region "Little Switzerland", from the vineyards in the Moselle region to the famous Minett Trail in the south, Luxembourg's scenery will inspire you. Awarded the "Leading Quality Trails – Best of Europe" label: 112 km Mullerthal Trail; 106 km cross-border Escarpardenne Eislek Trail from Luxembourg to Belgium; 53 km Escarpardenne Lee Trail.
- Luxemburg has over 600 km of cycle paths and an additionnal 700 km of mountain-bike trails.
- Unforgettable moments await you on the Luxembourg Moselle. Picturesque villages and cultural remains, surrounded by endless vineyards in a unique cultural and river landscape. Luxembourg's Moselle Region belongs to the Cultural routes of the Council of Europe.



**Paradise for cyclists:**  
**600 km of cycling paths**  
**and 700 km of mountain bike trails.**

- You will find unexpected sites in an unsuspected area in the Land of the Red Rocks, also known as the "Minett", in the south of Luxembourg. It's a unique mixture of the industrial past and new technologies. Since October 2020, the Minett officially bears the UNESCO "Man and Biosphere" label and is now part of a prestigious international network of more than 700 biosphere reserves in 124 countries.
- Not counting the microbreweries, Luxembourg produces five beers. It also produces a lot of wine, considering the size of the country. Most of the produced wine is white wine and crémant (sparkling wine). Luxembourg also produces some liquors and cider. The castle in Beaufort produces blackcurrant liquor that Luxembourgers are very fond of. Ramborn is the first Luxembourgish cider producer.
- The Luxembourg Science Center is a brand-new science and technology discovery centre, with funny and informative attractions. A permanent exhibition offers some interactive, multilingual experimental stations with open access.

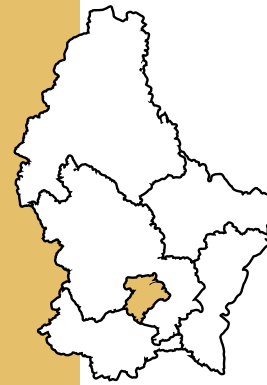

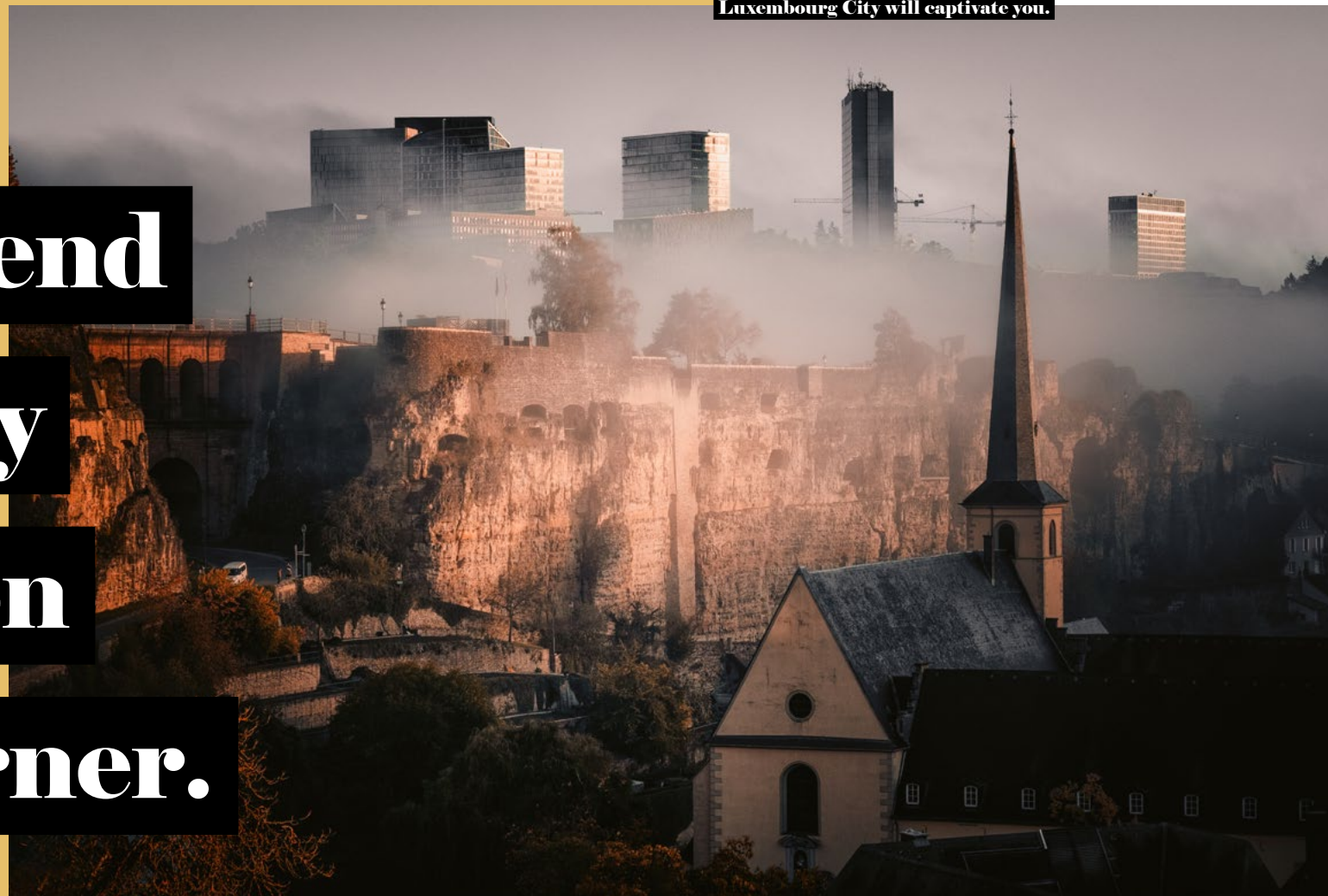
# Luxembourg City, the capital

## A visit to the city of Luxembourg means a journey through history.

As the cradle of the European Union, Luxembourg's capital is an open city with a fascinating mix of contrasts.

The Upper Town, perched on a rocky plateau, is home to the historic and traditional quarter. On the other side of the Alzette valley, Kirchberg is the modern and contemporary seat of numerous European, cultural, and financial institutions.

A cosmopolitan town where 165 nationalities meet, multilingual culture is ever present in the numerous museums and theatres. A true European microcosm awaits you in this city close to nature.

The fortifications of the Old Town of Luxembourg and the Old Town itself have been part of the UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1994.

Located between the centre of Luxembourg City and the railway station district, the romantic valley "Vallée de la Pétresse" with its extensive parks is a hidden gem.



The Bock casemates, an underground defence system of kilometre-long corridors, are one of Luxembourg's most important sights today. At their feet lies the "Clausen" district, historic and trendy at the same time. In the evening, the district is particularly popular for its bars and restaurants.

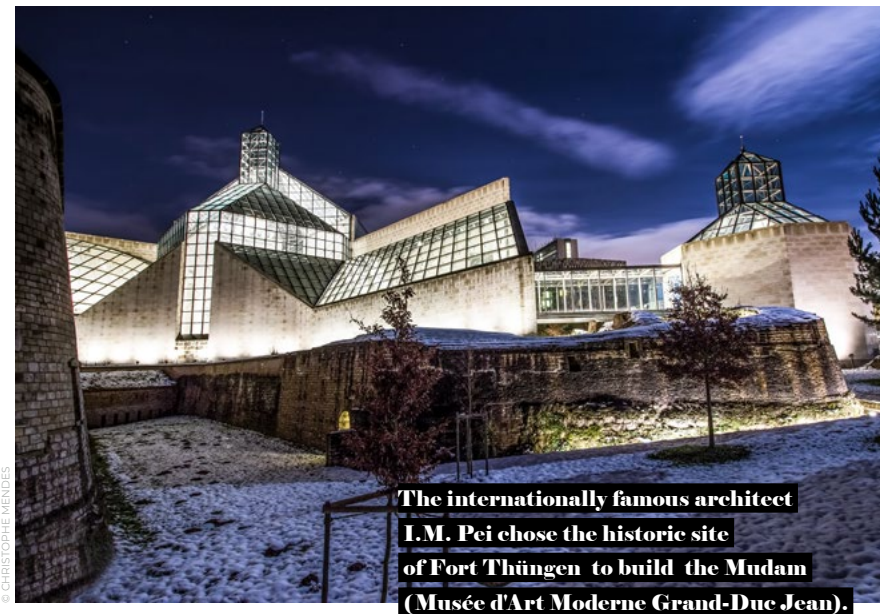

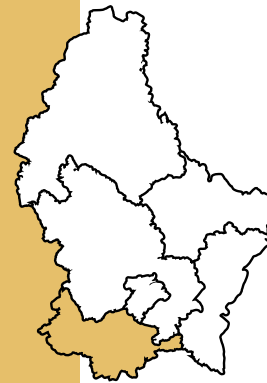
# Venues

- **D'Coque**, whether it's a company party, a conference, or a trade fair, the Coque puts various spaces at your disposal: amphitheatre, meeting rooms or even large spaces such as the arena arcades and gallery, all of which can be modulated and designed according to your wishes.

In the South of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg lies the Land of the Red Rocks, called Minett by the Luxembourgers. The mineral resources in the South once founded the country's richness. Former steel factories now house museums, galleries, and theatres. Past industrial prosperity has been replaced by cultural wealth.

**In 2020, the Minett region was approved by UNESCO as a biosphere reserve.**

# Venues

- **Artikuss**, technically fully equipped concert hall.
- **Schungfabrik**, event space in a former shoe factory. A place with history and its very own atmosphere.
- **Rockhal**, the concert hall in the South of Luxembourg. Two concert halls: the main hall with space for up to 6500 people and the club, for a maximum of 1200 guests.
- **Open-air museum Fond-de-Gras**, where industrial culture comes alive again. Historical buildings, as well as its own railway line, offer an exceptional setting for your next event or teambuilding.
- **Ellergronn Nature Reserve**, a former mine whose buildings have been restored and now house the Ellergronn Nature Conservation Centre and the Cockerill Mine Museum.

**The Fond-de-Gras open-air museum is accessible, for instance, with the "Train 1900" and its historic locomotives.**

**The Luxembourg Science Center is a fun and exciting science and technology discovery centre accessible to all ages.**

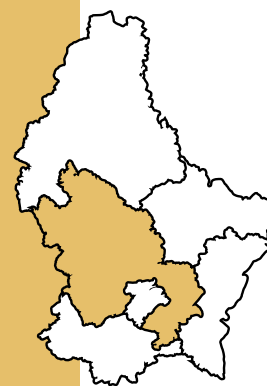

- Luxembourg Science Center, discover the wonders of our world. Experience a fun and exciting science and technology discovery centre, with more than 70 interactive stations, spectacular "science shows" and workshops.
- Historical train ride "Train 1900". Experience a real journey through time. Numerous steam and diesel locomotives, as well as two railcars are available.
- Historic mine train ride "Minièresbunn". Climb on board and discover the way of iron ore mining above and below ground.

## Relaxation, tranquillity, and pure nature in the centre of Luxembourg.

Charming villages, imposing castles, countless farms and renovated country estates take place in an enchanting landscape at the gates of the capital.

No time to hurry! Guttland invites you to slow tourism. Hundreds of kilometres of footpaths and cycle paths wind through the well-preserved landscapes and promote soft mobility.

Historical heritage is omnipresent here, be it in the Valley of the Seven Castles, at the various Gallo-Roman sites or in the rural museums.

Intact forests and meadows, remote rock formations, mysterious streams, small lakes, and breathtaking views – with its diverse landscapes, the Guttland is perfect for short hikes.

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Among the idyllic villages in Guttland, there is one that really stands out: Under the motto “Make Koler Kooler”, a young local artist transformed the facades of various village houses in Kähler (Koler in Luxembourgish) into a huge work of art that offers great motifs not only for gravel bike fans.

# Activities

→ Guided tours to the imposing castles and mysterious fortresses. Nowhere else in Luxembourg is the density of medieval buildings as high as here. The main attraction is the Valley of the 7 Castles.

→ Guttland trails, discover and slow down on the great circular hiking trails. Untouched forests and meadows, remote rock formations, mysterious streams, small lakes, and breathtaking views will make every hiker's heartbeat faster.

→ Cycling in the Guttland region offers you a variety of possibilities. In addition to the numerous, easily navigable national cycle paths, there are also thematic paths and mountain bike routes that promise action and cycling fun! In addition, you can cycle on several international routes to the neighbouring countries of Luxembourg.

→ Distillery museum, you will get an insight into the techniques and traditions of the distillery, which is over one hundred years old, and you can taste the in-house schnapps and liqueurs.

→ Waterworks SES, an exciting exploration on the topic of water awaits you here. Discover an underground drinking water source, the water reservoir on the "Rebiereg" and the water knowledge centre "Themaqua". Sightseeing tours at sunset are a special highlight.

→ Luxlait, experience one of the most modern dairies in Europe. The Milk Discovery Centre offers interactive stations, workshops, and a cooking atelier.

→ D'Millen, a former sawmill. Organisation of cultural activities with a focus on "sustainable development". Options for discovery tours and demonstrations.

→ Alpaca trekking, go hiking with alpacas and discover the region.

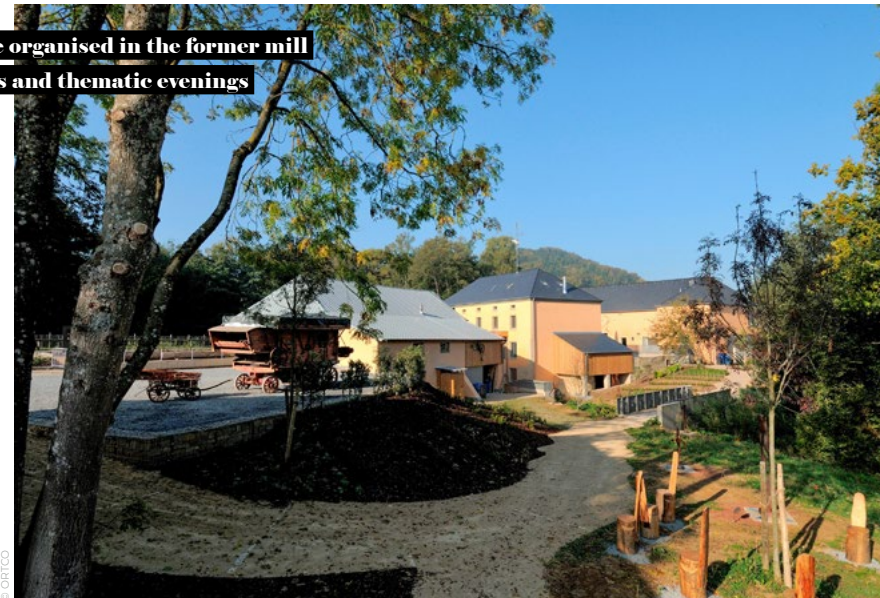
→ Steinfort Adventure, a climbing course located in the middle of the forest. The facility stands for an environmental tourism concept that raises awareness for the environment and sustainability while using the site ecologically.

→ Jumpbox, your next team building in Luxembourg's first indoor trampoline park. It offers a trampoline area of eight hundred square metres with different areas.

**The possibilities to discover the peaceful and rural charm of the Guttland by bicycle are numerous. Three major cycle routes are crossing the region.**



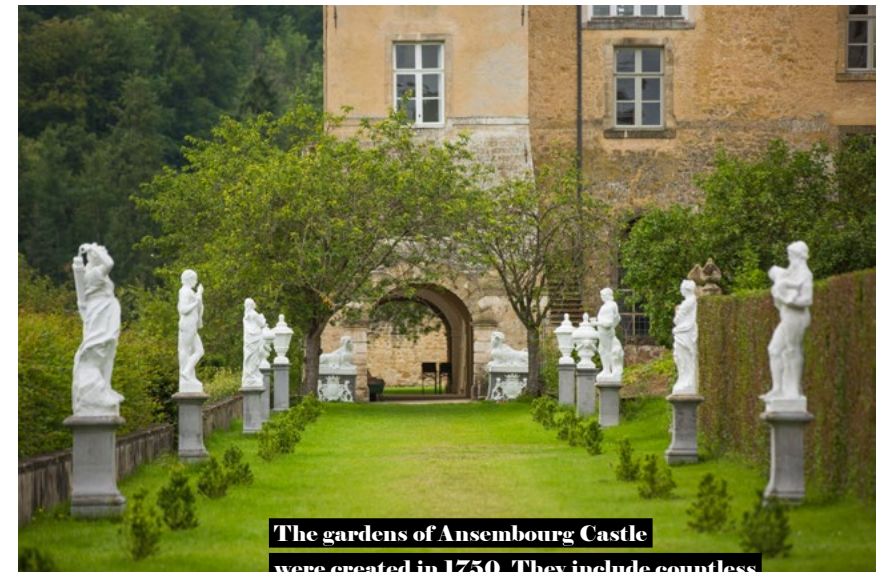
**A variety of cultural activities are organised in the former mill "D'Millen": from creative courses and thematic evenings to exhibitions and conferences.**

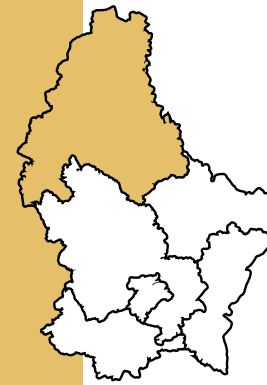
→ Luxlait Dairy, the ideal venue for your event or exhibition. A bright, 260 m² hall is available, with space for table service for 160 people.

→ Mierscher Kulturhaus, a place for creative art, with rooms for conferences and workshops.



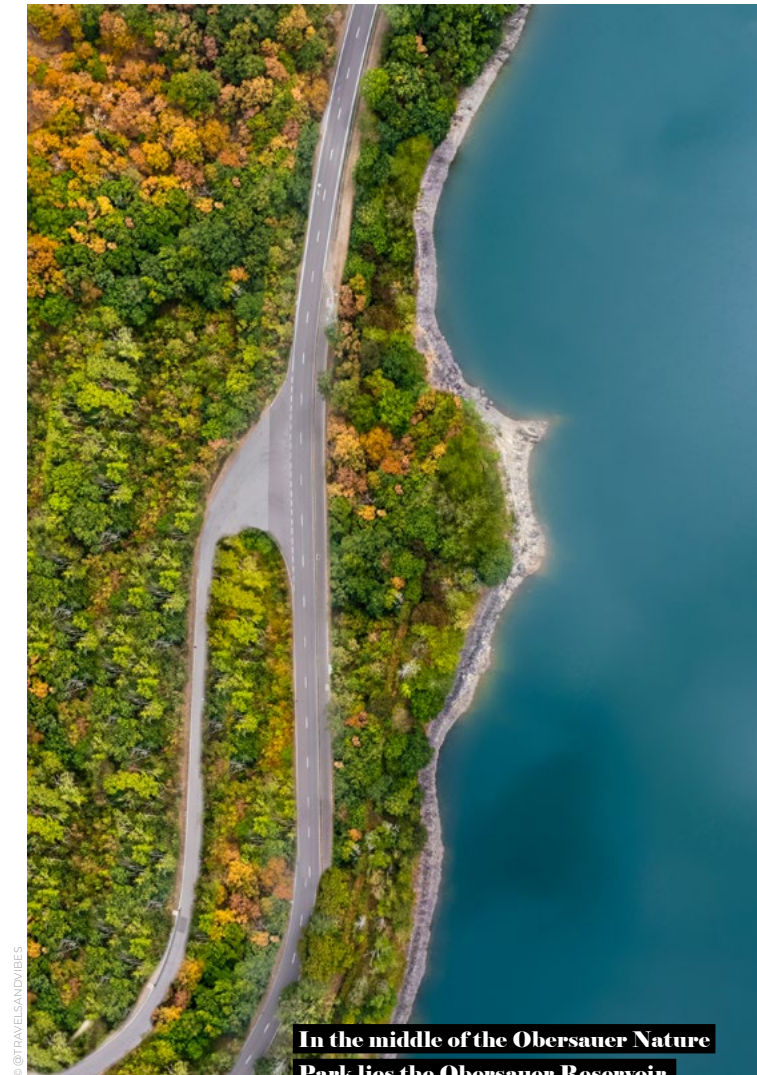
# Éislek, the Luxembourg Ardennes



Up in the north of Luxembourg, the Éislek region impresses with rich forests, green hills, deep valleys, and windy plateaus. Active tourists can enjoy the ups and downs of the hills and the impressive experience of nature while hiking or cycling, but art and history enthusiasts will also get their money's worth.

**The region has a total of 18 "Éislek Pied" circular hiking trails, which are based on the strict criteria of the European Hiking Association. Even more nature, even more experience!**

**Crossed by rough valleys, plateaus, and forests.**



**In the middle of the Obersauer Nature Park lies the Obersauer Reservoir, which has been dammed since 1961. In addition to supplying drinking water and generating electricity, the lake, which covers an area of 380 hectares, now serves as a much-used recreational area.**

In the North of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg you will find the tourist region of the Ardennes, called Éislek by the Luxembourgers and Ösling by the Germans.

With two nature parks and the largest lake in Luxembourg, the region is a true temple of nature for hikers. There are also breath-taking castles in this special natural area.

Memorial tourism is a distinctive feature of this Luxembourg region: numerous sights, monuments and museums remind us of the people who fought for freedom, especially in the Battle of the Bulge.

In the North of Luxembourg, "The Creative City" is emerging. Ettelbrück is trying to approach art from a new angle and make it accessible to everyone with the help of street art.

## Venues

- **Nature experience centre**, 6-hectare site with various possibilities for themed workshops in nature, traditional crafts, team building, company parties. Restaurant with typical regional dishes, sustainably made from in-house and local products.
- **Bourscheid Castle**, in the heart of the Éislek. The tranquillity and beauty of this historic site invites you to spend a special day in a magnificent location. In idyllic surroundings, with rooms that combine authenticity, charm and comfort, your event will be an exceptional moment.
- **"Rent a city"**: 1 city, 1 event – this concept uses the strengths and highlights of the entire city of Clervaux and the region.
- **Vianden Castle** offers a unique setting for your event. Whether rustic in the large wine cellar or festive in the large banqueting hall, the rooms offer space for 40 to 220 people.
- **Cube 521**, a large, multifunctional event space, at the northern tip of the country. Strengthened by the touristic infrastructure of the area, the spacious foyer as well as three practice rooms and the high-performance technical equipment offer the ideal setting for meetings, conferences, and congresses.

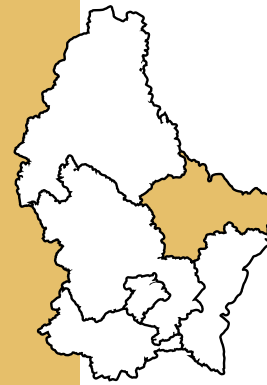
## Activities

- Cycling and discovery tours, the green North of Luxembourg offers bikers an enormous variety of landscapes and an extensive network of paths. In addition to the less frequented country roads, numerous signposted cycle paths and mountain bike trails invite you to ride. In the northern part of the Éislek, the Vennbahn, which has won several international awards, winds its way through the three countries of Germany, Belgium, and Luxembourg. With its 125 km, it is one of the longest railway-cycling routes in Europe.
- Visit to the National Museum of the Art of Brewing, of course with beer tasting. In the beer brewing workshop you also have the opportunity to brew your own beer.
- Hiking routes, with stunning views and wide mountain plateaus crossed by deeply incised river valleys, offer a special hiking experience. These include the Éislek Pied, a selection of the region's great hiking trails, the Nat'Our routes with cross-border hiking trails in the Our valley, and the Escapardenne Trail, one of the greatest long-distance hiking trails in Europe.
- Ride on Luxembourg's only chairlift, from the valley located at 220 m to a height of 440 m. Ideal starting point to explore Vianden Castle.
- Vianden Castle, one of the largest and greatest feudal residences of the Romanesque and Gothic periods, is today one of the most important architectural monuments in Europe.
- Nature Park Obersauer with a wide range of activities: canoeing, kayaking, beaches, solar boat tours, hiking, mountain biking and e-bike tours.
- Underground mine tour through the remains of the former copper mine. Follow in the footsteps of the miners.
- Visit to the gigantic, pumped storage power station, one of the most important in Europe.
- Classic car tours, an experience of a special kind. The route of 254 km in total leads through the entire North of Luxembourg, past majestic landscapes alternating between picturesque highlands and winding valleys.
- Memorial tourism individually designed tours on the subject of the Battle of the Bulge 1944/45 in Luxembourg and the neighbouring border area. The General Patton Memorial Museum in Ettelbrück pays tribute to the commander of the 3<sup>rd</sup> US Army, whose troops liberated the town of Ettelbrück during the Second World War.



# Mullerthal, the “Little Switzerland of Luxembourg”

**A unique  
biotope mixed  
with rocks.**



In the north-east of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg lies the Mullerthal region, or Mëllerdall in Luxembourgish. The region owes its name “Luxembourg’s Little Switzerland” to its landscape: forest massifs crossed by small, turbulent watercourses, exceptional biotopes with high sandstone formations rising from them, narrow rocky passages, mysterious caves, and gorges.

**In the green Mullerthal region, visitors can expect wild nature, rushing rivers and streams, imposing rocky landscapes, natural forests and very impressive rock massifs covered with moss.**



**A trail network consisting of the 112 km award-winning Mullerthal Trail and the numerous local hiking trails leads past the spectacular rocks and often even up onto them or through cracks and fissures between them.**

## The varied natural and geological heritage makes the region very special.

In the East of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg lies the Mullerthal region, often referred to as Luxembourg's Little Switzerland.

Two UNESCO World Heritage Sites await you here: the Echternach Spring Procession, which is included in UNESCO's representative list of immaterial cultural heritage, and the Mëlldall Nature & Geopark, which is part of the worldwide network of UNESCO Geoparks.

Discover this exceptional biotope characterised by surprising rock formations, as well as the historic castles in Beaufort and Larochette.

**Fascination rocks: Hiking through the crevices of the Luxembourg sandstone, through forests, light-flooded valleys, and along small watercourses.**



**You can visit two castles in Beaufort in the middle of nature. Near the idyllic castle pond, the impressive medieval castle rises above the scenery. If you go around the corner, you will discover the Renaissance castle from the 17th century.**



# Activities

- A variety of hiking opportunities through a unique biotope with rocks. The landscape of sandstone rocks owes its peculiar appearance to erosion over thousands of years. The diverse natural and geological heritage makes the region very special.
- Mullerthal Trail, with its 112 km it leads along the natural beauty of the region. Awarded the "Leading Quality Trails - Best of Europe" label. Hiking enjoyment is the order of the day here.
- Guided tours through the country, also possible as a combined "Drive & Hike".
- Mountain bike tours, five routes are available that lead through dense and intact forests and should please every mountain biker due to their nature.
- A great area for racing cyclists, the multifaceted landscape allows for dreamlike and varied tours. Cyclists will find sporting challenges in the hilly landscape with a constant alternation of crisp climbs and rapid descents. Finally, the magnificent views offer pure cycling pleasure.
- Ice Park Beaufort, offering ice karting, ice hockey and ice skating under a unique tent roof.
- Echternach, the oldest town in the country, with the most important religious monument in the country, the Willibrordus Basilica, has much to offer.
- Ramborn Cider Haff, award-winning apple tradition. Learn all about cider making and explore the complete production line during your visit. A tasting of the products is not to be missed at the end.
- Visit the 55 m high Aquatower. Immerse yourself in the fascinating world of drinking water.

# UNESCO

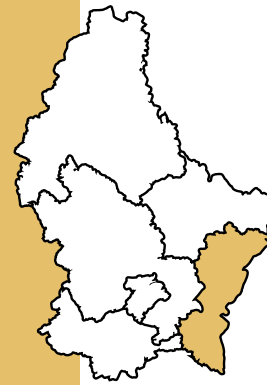
- The famous **Echternach hopping procession**, called the 'Sprangprëssessioun', which takes place on Whit Tuesday and brings together a national and international audience, was recognised as a UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage Site in 2010.
- The **Mëllerdall Nature & Geopark** was accepted into the international network of UNESCO Global Geoparks in 2022. The combination of nature and geopark speaks for the special significance and worthiness of protection of the landscape.

# Venues

- **Huellee** – a former millstone quarry, unusual outdoor location in the midst of enchanting nature, where millstones used to be quarried out for use in the countless mills in the region. Right next to the unusual rock formation is the **amphitheatre** with theatre seating. The covered rock shelter serves as a cosily furnished reception lounge. Catering facilities are available, as well as toilets.
- **Bourglinster Castle** with conference rooms and two restaurants, including La Distillerie, voted the best vegetable restaurant in the world in 2020. The Bel Etage with its historic rooms is used for organising concerts, conferences, and banquets. On the second floor of the castle is a modern conference centre.
- The **Trifolion Echternach** offers various design options for concerts, conferences, meetings, product presentations or catering events.
- A restored, barrier-free 17<sup>th</sup> century **flour mill** is the ideal location for company outings, team building activities and seminars in a natural setting. A 110 m<sup>2</sup> seminar room with modern technology and direct access to the outdoor area is available.
- Your event in the **Aquatower**. At a height of 50 m, you will experience unforgettable hours in an impressive ambience.

The Moselle stretches to the East of the country. The region is named after the river that forms the 42 km natural border between the Grand Duchy and Germany. The Moselle also reflects the open character of a region where one of the most important means of the European unification process was signed: the Schengen Agreement. The futuristically designed nature conservation centre “Biodiversum” was built on an artificially created island and is located at the foot of the vineyards in the nature reserve “Haff Réimech”. In the adjacent quarry ponds, you can swim and sunbathe in summer.

- From on board the M.S. “**Princesse Marie-Astrid**” you will discover the Moselle valley from a different perspective. It offers an exceptional setting, refined gastronomy, and modern technical equipment for successful events.
- **Thermal Park Mondorf-les-Bains**, a green jewel with forty-five hectares. Mondorf Domaine Thermal offers the ideal setting for corporate events. The various rooms are suitable for meetings, conferences, and seminars. Here you will find a hospitable setting that convinces with chic and elegance, completed by the fantastic cuisine.
- **Domaine Claude Bentz**, a unique place that combines wine, architecture, and nature. The perfect setting for your event with up to 60 standing places in the vinothèque and max. 108 seats in the event room. An additional highlight is the beautiful, 1-hectare landscaped garden.

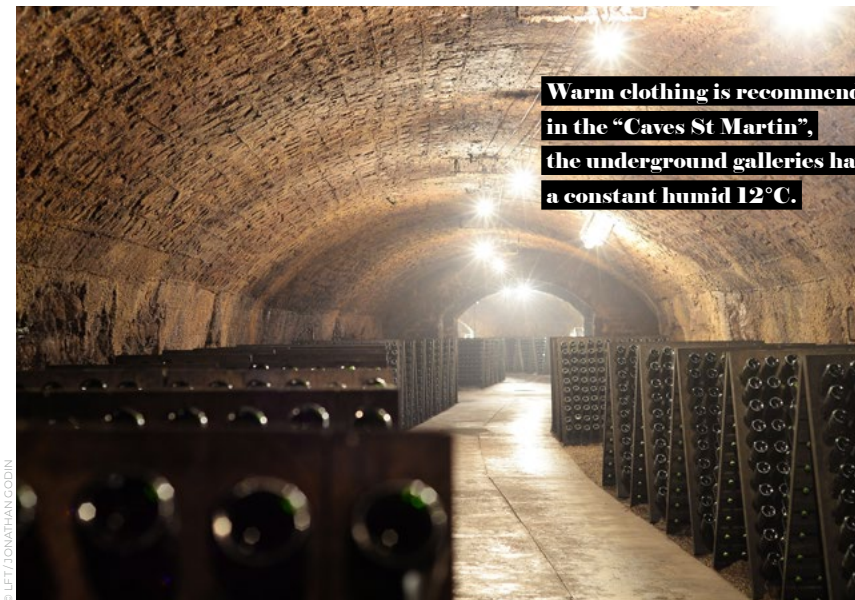

## Activities

- Discover the wine villages, with their vineyards and winegrowers. Learn all about local wine production and its special features during a wine walk and/or cellar tour and taste Luxembourg wines and Luxembourg Crémant.
- The diversity of typical winegrowers' farms and remarkable architectural trends can be best explored here.
- In addition to winegrowing, the art of distilling has also shaped this cultural landscape for several centuries. Specialities such as mirabelle, pomace brandy, but also the first whisky distillery in Luxembourg can be found here.
- Europa Museum Schengen, the small, picturesque winegrowing village of Schengen in the border triangle became famous worldwide over 30 years ago as a positive symbol for open borders in Europe. In the museum you will get an overview of the Schengen Agreement.
- Excursions on the Moselle. Enjoy the view from the water while vineyards, great villages and rolling hills and forests glide by. Can also be combined with a meal and/or wine tasting on the boat.
- Vintage car tours, over 115 km. This exceptional route lets you discover not only picturesque villages and endless vineyards, but also a unique cultural and river landscape.
- Go on a tour with a nature guide. The futuristically designed nature conservation centre Biodiversum was built on an artificially created island and is located at the foot of the vineyards. Various nature experience programs are available.
- Guided cycling tours through the border triangle, a boundless cycling pleasure.





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
